Call for UFO Board Directors

Are you interested in serving on the UFO board of directors? Would you like to have a voice in steering the UFO organization? Are you an active individual who can take on a task?

Qualifications for UFO Director.

### From the Bylaws

All directors are elected by the membership and act on behalf of the members, Officers are elected by the Board, and their duty also is to act on behalf of the members. Even though both Directors and Officers are slated by the Nominating Committee and endorsed by the Board, qualified candidates for the Board, submitted in a timely manner submitted from the floor will also be considered. The directors are elected for a term of two years. If practicable, one-half should be elected one year and one-half the next year to enhance continuity on the Board. There are no term limits. A minimum of three Board openings should be advertised every year. At least nine and no more than twenty members shall form the Board. The officers shall be elected in accordance with the Charter and all officers by their office shall be members of the Board.

### From the SOP

BOARD MEMBERS. The responsibility of the Board is to set overall goals of the Organization, establish policies and procedures to meet these goals, and then monitor the activities of the Organization to confirm that these policies and procedures are followed and that the overall goals of the organization are met. Typically, there is also a management structure through which the policies and procedures are implemented, but as we do not have this level of organization, the Board itself becomes the de-facto management group.

Each Board member should become familiar with, and be prepared to follow, all UFO documents related to the operation of the UFO organization. Such documents will be the Charter, Bylaws, Standard Operating Procedures, Responsibilities of Area

Directors, Board Policies, Administrative Procedures and Regulations, and others. All activities carried out by the Board member must be done within the parameters of these procedures while enjoying the personal benefit of the pride one feels having the status of being a Board member.

Board members should use their creativity to initiate, develop and prepare plans for any project they believe would benefit the UFO in some way, and submit it to the President for consideration. They may present the plan to the Board for review and action. It may then be modified, approved, and hopefully carried out to enrich the operation of the UFO.

These members are a Team having the prime responsibility of administering the affairs, developing and encouraging the activities of the over eighteen hundred UFO members. In determining subjects that are requested for consideration, discussion, and action at Board meetings, priority should try to be given to matters that affect the whole membership, followed by affairs to do with internal operations.

Each Board member should know the UFO Goals and Purposes, be able to initiate projects and promote them, and support other committees assigned to do the same. UFO Board Members shall be known as Directors.

#### Procedure:

The candidate should submit a resume stating qualifications and a statement of why they want to serve the UFO community. If the candidate has a particular area of interest please elaborate on this point in your submission.

Submissions will be reviewed by the nomination committee and presented to the board for consideration.

Bio: I soloed while still in high school at age 16 by working as a line boy at a small Southern California airport (now closed). Pay was one hour flying for **one day's work. Been flying ever since. Poor vision** kept me from a military or airline career, so I took




the alternate route to the cockpit with BS and MS degrees in Aeronautical Engineering from Cal Poly and USC. Built a lot of flying time in my Cessna 170A and later 1960 M model Bonanza, and part time flight instruction, while convincing my bosses at Systems Technology Inc. that I should be the company test pilot (thank God for contact lenses). That led to a lot of flying in research simulators (e.g. NASA Ames VMS, Boeing M-Cab, etc.) as well as variable stability aircraft (Princeton variable stability Navions and Calspan in-flight simulator). Also flew for Roy Lopresti at Mooney Aircraft to develop and flight-test flight control modifications on the M20 series as well as the all new M30 which later evolved into the TBM 700 series (M is for Mooney). Accumulated enough test pilot experience to be accepted to the Society of Experimental Test Pilots (SETP) and am now an Associate Fellow of that organization. Started Hoh Aeronautics, Inc. in late 1988. We were a small company with only 3 employees, but managed to accomplish some interesting projects. These included the development of the military Rotorcraft Flying Qualities Specification (ADS-33E PRF) for the U.S. Army Aeroflightdynamics Directorate, which is now an accepted and continually evolving standard around the world, a Cat IIIa HUD certification for BAE Systems, and a lowcost lightweight helicopter autopilot (HeliSAS<sup>™</sup>). The HUD project supported a 737 type rating, an ATP, and all the test flying for the HUD Certification out of the Mojave airport, initially on an old Boeing 737-300, a leased 737-800, and finally a new American Airlines 737-800. We achieved the Cat IIIa STC for the Boeing 737 in 1999. Upon completing that project, we received a small business innovative research (SBIR) grant from NASA Ames Research Center to develop a low-cost lightweight helicopter stability augmentation system and autopilot. This led to purchase of a used Robinson R44, which became our test bed and proof-of-concept demonstrator. I can now admit that my primary motivation for this project was to fly helicopters (I still have and fly the R44). An equally important motivation was to make flying helicopters safer: it is

just wrong to certify a flying machine that immediately diverges if the pilot removes **his or her hands from the controls. The system was considered "new and novel" by** the FAA (Patent US 7,108.232), resulting in 7 long years of negotiation before they finally issued an STC for the HeliSAS system on the R44. I licensed the system to S-TEC and it is now approved on numerous helicopter types with well over 1000 units sold around the world. I bought my 1977 BE-55E Baron in 1999 from an owner just outside of Paris France and flew it home (Iceland, Greenland route), and still fly it regularly from our house on the Alta Sierra Airpark (09CL) north of Sacramento in the Sierra Foothills. Photo is June and I at Tsuniah Lake in the outback in BC Canada – a wonderful fly-in fishing resort.

#### Jim Conn's Aviation Resume

#### DOB July 25, 1942

Jim Conn's first memory of flight was with his father in 1947. He soloed in a venerable C-150 in 1963 at the Chanute AFB, IL Aero club and then participated in multiple training flights aboard B-52 F & G models while based at Barksdale AFB, LA as a USAF Hounddog Missile Systems Analyst during the Cold War.

Empathetic towards anything airplane related, Jim figured out how to get other people to pay for his aviation passion while amassing 6,600+ hours of incident free flight. As Airport Commission Chairman, he was instrumental in the creation of a safe, new airport at Rice Lake, WI and its globally renowned TBM service Center.

Using his company's TBM 700 he then embarked on "PolarFlite" setting 11 FAI/NAA world sanctioned records in 1994. Named Wisconsin's Aviation Person of the Year in 1995 and designated as a Wright Brothers Master



Pilot in 2017, Jim retired to the lake country in Minnesota and now flies N1375C, a 1978 Cardinal Classic, over 100 hours per year on volunteer compassion flights in the Upper Midwest.

Jim recently completed his IPC during a low IMC spring day in Minnesota and lived to write about what he experienced as an aging pilot on that day in May 2022.


